

While we havent showcased the tabbed modules available on this demo they are still available for use. The tabs and their triggers appear on the page when you publish any module to the Tab1, Tab2, Tab3 or Tab4 position and the tab trigger titles are controlled in the template parameters. You can publish up to four individual modules to each tab position.

Zen Grid compatible templates have the ability to transform standard Joomla modules into sliding accordion-like modules. The sliders are initiated by simply adding the module class suffix -slide to the module. Once you have done that the title of the module becomes the trigger which either hides or displays the module content via a smooth jQuery transition.

Tabbed Area Settings

The following values control the titles of the triggers for the tabbed modules. In order for these titles to appear you need to make sure that at least one module is published to the tab1, tab2, tab3 or tab4 positions.

If you would like to disable the tabbed then make sure there are no modules published to these positions.
